

≡ GENERAL RULES and REGULATIONS ≡

All entries must remain at the Fair until 11:00 pm, August 8, 2009. Removal of entries prior to that time will forfeit awards.

1. Salt Lake County Fair Management and the Fair Director reserve the final absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle or determine all matters, questions and differences in regard there to, or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incidental to the Fair.

ENTRIES

2. Each entry must be made upon blank forms furnished by the Department Supervisor. Date of entry is given under each department's guidelines.
3. Unless otherwise provided, animals or articles can be entered only by the owner or producers, and any attempt to perpetrate a fraud by misrepresentation will bar the specimen from the competition.
4. Any article eligible for entry, not enumerated in the Fair Premium Book list, will be entered in it's appropriate class. No award shall be given unless by special action of the Salt Lake County Fair Management.
5. Entries may be made by Salt Lake County residents only.
6. Salt Lake County Fair management reserves the right to reject any article offered for exhibit simply as a means of advertising or that are deemed unsuitable for family viewing.

PLACING EXHIBITS

7. Exhibitors must attend to the delivery, in person or by agent, of articles or animals for exhibition to the Department Supervisor, and in all cases, the proper affixing of entry tags, and must claim property at the time designated by each department.
8. All exhibits, when assigned space, become subject to the control of the Department Supervisor and shall remain in place until closing date of the Fair, unless by action of the Salt Lake County Fair Management.

JUDGES

9. Judges will be selected with great care to ensure fairness and professionalism. There will be no attendance during the judging of the Fair, until awarding is completed.
10. No judges will be allowed to exhibit in the department in which they act as judge, or in which they may be directly or indirectly interested in the result as owner, agent or otherwise.
11. Judges must avoid contact with exhibitors and will refuse to hear the merits or demerits of exhibits upon which they will be expected to pass. Any attempt made by an exhibitor or agent to interfere or influence judges' decisions, must be reported to the Department Supervisor.

12. When requested by any Board Member or exhibitor, judges are expected to give reasons for their decisions by stating what constitutes points of excellence in the class of article being considered and by pointing out the superiority of one over the other.
13. The report of the judges shall be signed and forwarded to the Department Supervisor as soon as completed.

PROTESTS

14. A protest against a judge on the grounds of incompetence or previous bias must be made to the Management. A protest against an award must be made in writing to the Department Supervisor before the close of the day following the making of such award, stating the exact reason for the same and must be accompanied by affidavit and deposit of \$10.00. In case the protest is not sustained, the deposit shall be forfeited to Salt Lake County Fair Management. The Department Supervisor will notify the exhibitor of the protested article of such protest and both parties shall then have ten days to produce sworn testimony in the case. No award will be made until the Fair Management takes final action.

MISCELLANEOUS

15. All articles must be picked up by Sunday, August 9, 2009 before noon. Salt Lake County Fair Management is not responsible for loss, theft, or damage of personal property used or left at the Fair; nor any exhibits left after noon on Sunday, August 9, 2009.
16. Salt Lake County Fair Management reserves the right to remove from the grounds, any exhibit that may be falsely entered, or deemed unsuitable or objectionable, and to remove any signs, banners or advertising matter deemed unsuitable or objectionable, without assigning reason therefore.
17. Salt Lake County Fair Management, through its officers and with the aid of security personnel, will use diligence to care for all property placed under its charge. However, it is expressly understood that it will assume no responsibility for injuries or losses from any cause.

BUILDING and GROUNDS

18. All exhibitors and concessionaires will be held responsible for the condition and appearance of their own space, or booth and the passageway immediately in front of it. Garbage must be put out early in the morning and the Fair Management will see to its removal from the grounds.
19. No person, firm, corporation, or association shall erect a building on any part of the County Fair Grounds without first obtaining the consent of the Salt Lake County Fair, and no transfer of ownership of any such building shall be valid except on the written consent of said Salt Lake County Fair.
